Amual STEPS Awards Program Held At Vocational Tech Center

Approximately 100 parents, students, teachers and administrators filled the auditorium of the K.C. Vocational Technical Education Center, 1215 E. Truman Road on Tuesday evening to attend the Annual STEPS (Striving Toward Excellence In The Performance Of Students) Awards Program.

According to Michael Charles, acting coordinator of the Kansas City, Mo. School District STEPS program, the occasion for awards was to recognize outstanding growth and achievement students and schools have made during the year in the areas of reading and mathematics.

Charles gives credit for much of the growth to teachers' participation in inservice training sessions which have focused on improving the classroom learning environment and avenues to enhance the process.

The STEPS program operates in 18 of the District's elementary schools. It is funded through the Effective Schools component of desegregation court orders presently being implement-

ed in the District.

Awards were given to schools by grade categories for first, second and third places. Criteria for ranking award recipients was based on the spring, 1987 performance on the Iowa Test Of Basic Skills (ITBS).

Award recipients for grade one in reading were: first place—Chick; second place—Holmes; and third place—Attucks. In mathematics those receiving awards were: first place, Willard; second place—Holmes; and third place—Pershing.

Recipients for grade two in reading were: first place—Meservey; second place—Kumpf; and third place—Faxon. For mathematics they were: first place—Kumpf; second place—Meservey; and third place—Holmes.

Getting awards for grade three in reading were: first place—Graceland; second place—Willard; and third place—Pinkerton. Mathematics recipients were: first place—Willard; second place—Faxon; and third place—Franklin.

Fourth grade award recipients for reading were:

first place—Pershing; second place—Chick; and third place—Meservey. Mathematics winners were: first place—Chick; second place—Willard; and third place—Meservey.


