In reference to our telephone conversation on Thursday, February 25, regarding a skit written and produced by one of our fourth grade classes, I am forwarding the following information.

A fourth grade class of approximately 32 pupils, under the leadership of the classroom teacher, Mrs. Susan Hazan, (and with the cooperation of several parents) plans to take a skit entitled "Brother Lee Love Saves Purpleville", across the city to perform for other schools and interested groups,

The class presented the skit in two assemblies for their own classmates here at the Nelson School during Brotherhood Week. At one of these assemblies the Most Honorable Mayor Ilus H. Davis was in attendance.

The tour is scheduled to begin the fourth week of March, through the last week of May. Two rehearsals are planned in advance of scheduling tours. The first rehearsal will be at the Allen School, 706 W. 42nd Street, on Tuesday, March 2, at 10:00 a.m., and the second is planned for Tuesday, March 9, at 9:00 a.m. at the J.S. Chick School, 5101 E. 53rd Street. At each rehearsal the troupe will play before an audience of 4th through 6th grade students.
